

Orphan Grain Train Annual Report for FY June 1, 2010 – May 31, 2011

205 full shipments of relief supplies were shipped to countries around the world. 59 full semi-loads went to domestic locations, and 146 - 40 ft. (or larger) shipping containers, went to destinations overseas. Haiti received 74 shipments, which included 2 shipping containers that were fully equipped medical / dental clinics & supplies. The 2 - 40 ft. shipping containers will remain in Haiti and serve as the clinic buildings.

From June 1, 2010 to May 31, 2011, Orphan Grain Train shipped over 93 tons of beans, 20 tons of rice, and 2.5 million servings of rice/soy meals to starving people here in the US, and in destitute countries around the world.

Three new countries receiving shipments from Orphan Grain Train this year were Chile, Peru, and the Czech Republic. The list of countries receiving aid from Orphan Grain Train has been corrected as some of our recipients from the past were overlooked. The countries added are Dominican Republic, Iraq, Bangladesh, Ecuador, and Uruguay, bringing our total number of countries served to 57.

Disaster Relief

Birmingham, AL received their first semi-load of disaster assistance from Orphan Grain Train following the deadly tornados that roared through back in May. The shipment included tarps, charcoal, lighter fluid, clothing, and pet food, among other things. More shipments are planned throughout the summer of 2011.

Volunteers continue to be supported down in the areas affected by Hurricane Katrina. Six portable bedroom units and a shower unit were dispatched to the New Orleans area, while two bedroom units were taken to Slidell, LA. Volunteers helping with the rebuilding effort are happy to have a place to shower and to sleep.

Indiana flood victims received two semi-loads of bottled water from Orphan Grain Train.

Orphanages, Prison, and Hospitals

Orphan Grain Train's Adopt an Orphanage program now serves 58 orphanages in Russia, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, and Kyrgyzstan. Through this program, generous donors send monthly financial contributions to provide medical supplies, medicines, hygiene supplies and other items for children in the orphanages. Three hospitals and five prisons are also served in this part of the world.

Shunt Program

As of May, 31, 2011, 2000 lives had been saved through the medical shunt program. Many more young lives will be saved in the near future as 50 more medical shunts were just donated for needy children in Kyrgyzstan.
