## **Volunteer Spotlight**

Orphan Grain Train is powered by volunteers and John Runyon is a reason for our success. For the past two and a half years, John has been the head of our "Boxing Team", as he organizes the pickup of boxes from various Chick-fil-A locations. As most of you know, OGT Maryland packs and



ships most of our donated items in Chick-fil-A boxes. Our volunteers pick up approximately 1,000 boxes per month from local restaurants. John himself picks up boxes three times a week at the location in Annapolis. He inspects every box that comes in and recycles unusable boxes. He works with the Monday packing team, taping boxes so they can be filled. In addition, John can frequently be seen in the sorting room or the warehouse with a broom or vacuum in his hand. Our facility has never been so clean!

John volunteered for many years with the "Medical Equipment Ministry" at his former church in New Jersey. Upon moving to Maryland, he saw a posting in his community Facebook page about donating medical equipment to OGT. John dropped by to check us out, and as they say .... "The rest is history!" In addition to volunteering at OGT, John is a docent at the Annapolis Maritime Museum in Eastport. He also volunteers with the Cape Conservation Corps, removing damaging vines and other invasive plants and replacing them with native plants in his neighborhood parks in Cape St. Claire. When not volunteering, John and his

wife enjoy hiking, canoeing and attending art exhibits, historic sites, and theater productions around Annapolis.

John says he "loves watching empty boxes come into the warehouse and filled boxes leave the warehouse to be delivered to those in need!" We thank John for the selfless giving of his time and for his dedication to our mission of serving the less fortunate around the world.

#### **Shipment Cleared and Offloaded in Ghana**

In mid-December, two truckloads of donated goods were delivered by OGT volunteers to a warehouse in Clinton, Maryland. From there, the goods were loaded into a container and sent to Accra, Ghana. **Donated Goods Headed to Cameroon** 



On January 31st, OGT Maryland Branch loaded a 22,800 pound shipment to Cameroon of clothing, shoes, medical durable equipment, hygiene and school supplies, paraments, and dry food, with a total value of over \$260,000. A shout out goes to the loading team who made this gift to the people of Cameroon a reality. Furthermore, a huge thank-you goes to all those volunteers who tirelessly picked up, boxed, washed, repaired, sorted, packed, and stored all that was shipped. We have now significantly

vacated the warehouse in preparation for the Spring donation season - a strategic goal we set 12 months ago. We ask our God to now fill our warehouse with the plethora of goods needed by the people we serve - in the Name of His Son.

Upon learning of this recent shipment, our Branch received gratitude and blessings from Rev. Frouisou of Cameroon. He wrote:

"Calvary greetings from Yaoundé in Cameroon, today, and thank you so much for the good news. We pray to the Master of the Mission to bless all our volunteers and generous donors from the OGT, who always work so hard to support the Lord's mission of compassion and love of the most vulnerable among us."

While it is easy to get so focused on our branch processes and what it takes to keep the warehouse running, we sometimes forget that we are indeed serving as the Hands and Feet of Christ!
