# OGT Volunteers Enjoy Dinner and Fellowship at St. Andrew Ukranian Orthodox Cathedral





On Sunday, January 12, many of our OGT volunteers experienced a special treat. Members of St. Andrew' Ukrainian Orthodox Cathedral and Humanitarian Center hosted an ethnic dinner for us at the center. Before the meal we received a tour of the church and, after, watched some heart- rendering videos of Ukrainian recipients thanking us for our support. We have sent Luci Lights, medical supplies and equipment, and money for prayer books. In the videos, one of the recipients told us, "Your lights and gifts told us we are not alone." Another said, in response to the Luci Lights, "Light lights our hearts and warms our souls."

As you recall, in 2022, we collected money and were able to purchase over 5,000 Luci Lights that we delivered to the Center and they shipped for us. We are thankful that, weekly, some of our volunteers, (Margie Davis and her crew!) come up from Silver Spring to work at the Warehouse. When they return, they take carloads of medical supplies down to St. Andrew's for us. We are thankful to Father Steliac and his wife Marta, as well as all of the volunteers at the Center, for their partnership with us.

## Helping the Orphans of Ukraine

Last October, Alla, a young woman from Ukraine, spoke to OGT supporters at the warehouse. She herself grew up in an orphanage in Ukraine and today she and her team are caring for orphans in six different Ukrainian orphanages. The children's possessions are few and their needs are many. After hearing her speak, we collected close to \$3500 in cash and also pledged to send a 40-foot container to Ukraine, filled with much needed items for the children. We are now in the process of collecting some of the items that she has requested.

We are currently focusing on two areas - education and recreation. We are now accepting the following items:
