Greetings from OGT, Jonesville, Indiana!

Hurricane Helene and Milton response has been phenomenal! Once again, the generosity of the people of this area (and beyond) has proven to be exceptional. The plea went out over email blast, church announcements, Bridge FM and WCSI radio interviews, as well as word of mouth, and folks responded. The OGT 48' trailer was full and made its way to eastern Tennessee and was loaded at Bristol Motor Speedway. From there, the donations will be distributed to areas devastated by the torrential hurricane rains.



This was one of 3 OGT trailers spotted for donations. One was at St. Peter's, another at Immanuel, Seymour,

and the third at St. Paul, Clifty.

Physical donations of water, diapers and wipes, cleaning supplies, brooms, canned and dry foods, shovels, mops, scrub buckets, and countless new blankets filled the trailer.



With financial donations we were able to purchase 10 generators (which when were promised to be at OGT by the 22nd but then got delayed to the 29th and missed the trailer load) and will be sent as needed on a future load. At the direction of our contact

person in Tennessee, OGT will send a load of clothes and furniture when needed.

It always takes time to figure out the levels of needs and how best to distribute them.



October 24 the trailer finally left our yard after some electrical hook up issues got resolved.



Randy Fisher called the next morning to report that a flat tire on the trailer had been fixed and he was on his way to the Speedway for the drop off. On the way he was alerted to smoke coming out of the back wheel on the trailer. Turns out the bearings decided they had gone far enough. At this point the load was about a mile from the drop point. After getting a wrecker involved to get the load to its destination, we made arrangements with the wrecker service to keep the trailer (something we had discussed before) in place of a bill. It was actually a win-win for both parties! OGT is now officially out of the larger trailering business, and when needed, we will hire. It's been an interesting adventure with Hurricane Helene. But, as with all things, the Lord remains in control and He sees us through it and we can worship Him for His faithfulness in letting us serve others in His name. All praise be to Him!
