

We co-ordinate with different charities in Wichita who aid people in need directly, such as Church on The Street, Passageways, and Open Door Ministries. BUT, one day, a young man came through our door and asked for a "BAR OF SOAP". We gave him the soap and then our volunteers started a discussion on how we could help these folks more. We came up with an idea to have a small package at the door to handout if anyone asked for help. We patterned it after our Hygiene Kits, but it also includes a t-shirt and a Resource Guide put out by Uhited Way on places where the homeless can go

to receive other benefits. The sticker on the bag says "Our Gift To You" from Orphan Grain Train. Not sure how many of these we will ever actually hand out, but we are trying to co-ordinate with a local charity that provides hygiene items to the homeless. Maybe we can reach more through them
