But Joseph said to (his brothers), "Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God? You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives! So then, don't be afraid. I will provide for you and your children." And he reassured them and spoke kindly to them. (Gen. 50:19-21) Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven . . . Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, "Brother, let me take the speck out of your eye," when you yourself fail to see the plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye. (Luke 6:36-37, 41-42)

Judge Not: We are commanded not to judge. Joseph is our example. If anyone had a right to condemn those who had offended him, it was Joseph. And yet, "He reassured (his brothers) and spoke kindly to them." And we

are called to soften our hearts toward those who offend us—to forgive as the Lord has forgiven us, remembering the planks in our own eyes. **Prayer:** Dear Jesus, forgive us for our hypocrisy. Bless us to love our neighbors, not just as ourselves, but as You have loved us. Amen.
