Weekly Devotion

Jacob left Beersheba and set out for Haran. When he reached a certain place, he stopped for the night because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones there, he put it under his head and lay down to sleep. He had a dream in which he saw a stairway resting on the earth, with its top reaching to heaven, and the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. There above it stood the Lord, and He said, "I am the Lord, the God of your father Abraham and the God of Isaac. I will give you and your descendants the land on which you are lying. Your descendants will be like the dust of the earth, and you will spread out to the west and to the east, to the north and to the south. All peoples on earth will be blessed through you and your offspring. I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go, and I will bring you back to this land. I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you." When Jacob awoke from his sleep, he thought, "Surely the Lord is in this place, and I was not aware of it." He was afraid and said, "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God; this is the gate of heaven." Early the next morning Jacob took the stone he had placed under his head and set it up as a pillar & poured oil on top of it. He

called the place Bethel (Gen. 28:10-19a) Vivid Dreams: I had a vivid dream the other night. I dreamt that I was still principal of Lutheran High Northeast in Norfolk, NE. Some of my former staff and students were in the dream. We were trying to figure out ways to cope with COVID. Some of the ideas were pretty wild. Incidentally, I dream in color. Do you?

Jacob certainly had a vivid dream, didn't he? "He saw a stairway resting on the earth, with its top reaching to heaven." He saw "angels of God ascending and descending on it." Perhaps most vividly of all, "above it stood the Lord." The Lord reminded Jacob that He was "the God of (his) father Abaraham and the God of Isaac." He adds a vivid promise: "All the peoples on earth will be blessed through you and your offspring. I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go." Jacob is so shaken by this dream that he names the place "Bethel," which means "holy place." According to <u>dictionary.com</u>, a "covenant" is "an agreement, usually formal, between two or more persons to do or not do something specified." The Lord's message to Jacob was His covenant. It was one-sided, however, because there was nothing Jacob could do to fulfill his side of the covenant. God has made a covenant with you and me, too. He has promised that we are His children, bought with the blood of His Son Jesus, our Lord and Savior. Jesus is the "offspring" spoken of by God in this covenant. This covenant is also entirely one-sided. There is nothing we can do to accomplish our side of this covenant. It has all been accomplished for us by Jesus.

Prayer: Thank You, Holy Father, for establishing Your covenant with us through Your Son Jesus, in whose name we pray. Amen.
