Volunteers loaded 1,800 pounds for various foods, boxes of Hygiene supplies, medical supplies, blankets, layette kits, tools, disaster cleaning buckets, beds, refrigerators and other needed items for Christian Appalachian Project (CAP) in Kentucky. CAP is assisting several areas in need of disaster relief supplies and will distribute the items to where needed most. Weekly Devotion

(Joshua said), "Now fear the Lord and serve Him with all faithfulness. Throw away the gods your forefathers worshipped beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the Lord. But if serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." Then the people answered, "Far be it for us to forsake the Lord to serve other gods! It was the Lord our God Himself who brought us and our fathers up out of Egypt, from that land of slavery, and performed those great signs before our eyes. He protected us on our entire journey and among all the nations through which we traveled. And the Lord drove out before us all the nations, including the Amorites, who lived in the land. We too will serve the He God." Lord. because is our (Josh. 24:14-18) A Challenge: Sometimes we enjoy a challenge; sometimes not. Someone may challenge us to a fight. Not a good challenge to accept. In several ministries where I've served, someone made a challenge grant available to help us raise money, and people generally responded enthusiastically. During their 40-year stint in the Sinai wilderness, the people of Israel's commitment to the God who led them out of Egypt was often less than stellar. There was that whole golden calf incident. They constantly grumbled and whined, which reached a head when they heard the dire warnings from 10 of the men who scouted ahead of them about the dangers they would face. The people refused to proceed. As a consequence, none of that original generation was allowed to enter Canaan, except for Joshua and Caleb.

Now the next generation is on the cusp of entering the Promised Land again. Serious challenges remain, and apparently some of the people were still clinging to the "gods (their) forefathers worshipped beyond the River and in Egypt." So, here's Joshua's challenge: "Throw away (those gods).

... then choose for yourselves this day whom you will choose." Joshua, Moses' hand-picked successor, makes it clear. "But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." The people accept the challenge. Sadly, they will often falter. What about us? What has God challenged us to do with our lives? What has He challenged us to do through the mission and ministry of Orphan Grain Train? His challenges are certainly worthy of our prayers and efforts.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, may we cast away the idols in our own lives and seek to meet Your challenges to serve only You and the people whom You've called us to serve. In Jesus' name. Amen.
