

Weekly Devotion

Be on guard! Be alert! You do not know when that time will come. It's like a man going away: He leaves the house and puts his servants in charge, each with his assigned task, and tells the one at the door to keep watch. Therefore keep watch because you do not know when the owner of the house will come back—whether in the evening, or at midnight, or when the rooster crows, or at dawn. If he comes suddenly, do not let him find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to everyone: "Watch!" (Mark 13:33-37) Therefore you do not lack any spiritual gift as you eagerly wait for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed. He will keep you strong to the end, so that you will be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God, who has called

you into fellowship with His Son Jesus Christ our Lord, is faithful. (1 Cor. 1:7-9)

Watch Out! An Army sentry has one job, and he better not blow it. He is to remain alert, making sure that an enemy does not infiltrate the ranks. His superior may show up at any time to check on him. The penalty for failing to keep watch, for sleeping on duty? I'm sure it's pretty harsh. Although Jesus was talking about a servant whose master has placed him "at the door to keep watch," there is a spiritual lesson here. "Keep watch because you do not know when the owner of the house will come back . . . if he comes suddenly, do not let him find you sleeping. What I say to you, I say to everyone: 'Watch!'" Jesus comes for us when we die. He comes for everyone on the Last Day. How do we know that we will be prepared for His coming?

St. Paul has the answer in 1 Corinthians. "(Jesus) will keep you strong to the end, so that you will be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ." "Blameless" because we led a perfect life? No. "Blameless" because of our faith, God's free gift to you and me, which means that we will be prepared.

Prayer: Dear Lord, prepare us for Your coming. Amen.
