<u>Michigan Branch volunteers in Sebewaing</u> loaded & delivered 5,400 pounds of various foods, 135 cases of bottled water, pet food, generators, cleaning buckets, 21 OGT Christmas Gift boxes and many other disaster relief items for Restoration Church in Willow Springs, NC. The goods will be shared with many families still recovering from the effects of Hurricane Helene.

#### **Weekly Devotion**

And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for He has been mindful of the humble state of His servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me—holy is His name. His mercy extends to those who fear Him, from generation to generation. He has performed mighty deeds with His arm; He has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts. He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble. He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty. He has helped His servant Israel, remembering to be merciful to Abraham and his descendants forever, even as He swore to our fathers." (Luke 1:46-55) The Magnificat: This text found in the Gospel of Luke is called the "Magnificat." I looked up "Magnificat" online & found out that it's the Latin word for "magnify." To "magnify" means to "make great." [dictionary.com] Synonyms include "exalt" and "glorify." [thesaurus.com] So, let me set the stage. Mary is not married. In fact, she is a virgin & probably quite young. By the power of the Holy Spirit, she has conceived the Savior. This is truly a miracle! She goes to visit her cousin Elizabeth, who is pregnant, although she is well past the age of child-bearing-another great miracle. When Mary greets her cousin, Elizabeth's baby, who will be John the Baptist, "leaped in her womb." (Luke 1:41) Elizabeth responds with these words: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! But why am I so favored that the mother of my Lord should come to me? As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed is she who has believed that what the Lord has said to her will be accomplished." (Luke 1:42b-45) And Mary responds with the "Magnificat." Christians have sung the "Magnificat" for countless generations. [You can find it in the Lutheran Service Book, Hymn #248.] Sometimes we call it the "Song of Mary." Even as Mary rejoiced in "God (her) Savior, for He has been mindful of the humble

*state of His servant,"* we rejoice as we prepare to celebrate the miracle of Christmas: the coming of God's Son, born of Mary, born the Savior of the world.

**Prayer:** O Lord, we rejoice in Your mercy! Amen.
