Weekly Devotion

READ LUKE 2:1-20. "Then all the trees of the forest will sing for joy; they will sing before the Lord, for He comes . . . (Ps. 96:12b-13a) For to us a Child is born, to us a Son is given . . . (Is. 9:6a) While they were there, the time came for the Baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a Son.

(Luke 2:6-7a)

Luke 2: Do you ever get tired of hearing or reading the Christmas story, recorded by the evangelist Luke? Neither do I. I grew up in Concordia, MO, and attended St. Paul's Lutheran School. Every year on Christmas Eve we presented the children's Christmas program in church. *Luke 2:1-20* was always recited, verse by verse, by the children. I was one of those kids.

Although I don't remember which individual verses I would have spoken, I know that I would have spoken at least some of them, and they made a and lasting impression deep on me. Luke 2:1-20 is a traditional reading for Christmas Eve. And well it should be! It recounts the glorious birth of our Savior Jesus Christ. It amazes us that the Son of God was born in a stable and laid in a feeding trough. It amazes us with the announcement by the angels to lowly shepherds. And it amazes us as we read how the shepherds traveled to Bethlehem "to see this thing which the Lord has told us about." (Luke 2:15b) Not only that, but also "the shepherds returned, glorifying God for all the things they had seen and heard, which were just as they had been told." (v. 20) These lowly might very well have been the first evangelists. shepherds Jesus—"He who saves"—came into the world as a humble baby, born to humble parents, born to save His people from their sins. What could be more unlikely than this? God is born a human, yet still "very God of very God," as we confess in the words of the Nicene Creed. Jesus is no longer a baby. He will come again on the Last Day to deliver us from death and take with Him us to be forever in heaven. **Prayer:** Dear Lord, may we never grow tired of hearing the Christmas story. May we never grow tired of giving You all honor and praise! Amen.
