Weekly Devotion

Bethlehem's Star: After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw His star in the east and have come to worship Him"... After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the Child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the Child with His mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped Him. (Matt. 2:1-2,

Over the years there has been much speculation about the nature of the Bethlehem Star. Some think it was a planetary conjunction. Others attribute it to a meteor or comet. Some have even suggested that it may have been a UFO. Seriously? Whatever the case, the Magi—or wisemen—definitely saw something in the sky that led them from the east to Judah. Here's what I found at crosswalk.com: "Whenever people ask about the Star of Bethlehem, they want to know if there was an actual recorded astronomical event that accompanied the birth of Jesus. But one of the many problems with trying to answer is that we do not know for sure when Jesus was born. Also, even if we assume a range of years when Jesus might have been born, there are no clear-cut astronomical events within the range that would

meet all the requirements of the Star of Bethlehem according to Scripture, science, and secular history." So, what DO we know? According to St. Matthew, the Magi were led by a "star" from the east to Jerusalem. Then it led them on to Bethlehem, leading them directly to Baby Jesus. Gentiles encountered the Savior of the world in the flesh for the first time. We read in Isaiah 60:1-3, "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you. See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the Lord rises upon you and His glory appears over you. Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of the dawn." God's Light, our Savior Jesus, shone into a dark world then. It shines into a dark world now. **Prayer Prompt:** Praise God that He has shined His light into your heart. Pray that His light would shine into the hearts of those who don't know Jesus.
