Weekly Devotion

Some time later God tested Abraham. He said to Him, "Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, Isaac, whom you love, and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains I will tell you about"... When they reached the place God had told him about, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. He bound his son Isaac and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. Then he reached out his hand and took the knife to slay his son. But the Angel of the Lord called out to him from heaven,

"Abraham! Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. "Do not lay a hand on the boy," He said. "Do not do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you have not withheld from Me your son, your only son"... The Angel of the Lord called to Abraham a second time and said, "I swear by Myself," declares the Lord, "that because you have done this and have not withheld your son, your only son, I will surely bless you and make your descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as the sand on the seashore. Your descendants will take possession of the cities of their enemies, and through your offspring all nations on earth will be blessed, because you obeyed Me." (Gen. 22:1-2, 9-12, 15-18)

Sacrificing a Son: In *Genesis Chapter 22*, we read how God tested Abraham by commanding him to sacrifice His only son Isaac. What a test! Lois and I know what it's like to lose a son. After a miscarriage, Lois got pregnant a second time. There were severe complications, and ultimately, we lost this child, a boy. I can only imagine what must have gone through Abraham's mind as he heard God's command. And you'll be glad to know that Lois and I were subsequently blessed with three beautiful children, including a son.

Incredibly, Abraham complies with God's command! In fact, there is no evidence that he objected, argued, or even hesitated. He heads for the mountain in "the region of Moriah" with the intent of sacrificing his "only son," a son whom God had promised him, a son whom he treasured. This story has a happy ending. As Abraham prepares to kill Isaac, the "Angel of the Lord"—the pre-incarnate Christ—stays his hand. This has been a test of Abraham's faith. Abraham passes the test.

Abraham was prepared to sacrifice his only son, the son whom he loved. God the Father was prepared to sacrifice His Son, His only-begotten Son, the Son whom He loved. The difference? The Father followed through. Jesus was sacrificed on the cross. The Father was willing to do this for the

sake of His great and gracious love for all humankind.

Prayer: We praise You, O Lord, for You sacrificed Your only Son—Your beloved Son—for our sake. And You raised Him from the dead. You are a great and merciful and awesome God! Amen.
